### AEDC forms Tax Exemption Task Force, awaits State Guidelines to Review


Under the Governor's Executive Order, all new application for Industrial Tax Exemption (ITEP) will require supporting resolutions from local government entities. The AEDC Task Force will determine procedures to address processing, on average, 70 projects per year. Mike Eades, AEDC President/CEO said, "This is a game changer and processing applications in a timely fashion may be critical to the success of many projects." Members include the Parish Government, School Board, Sheriff's Office, the Assessor's Office, the Industrial Development Board, the Cities of Gonzales and Donaldsonville, and the Town of Sorrento. The Task Force will begin its review process once state guidelines are received.

#### Parish Economic Development

**Employment Remains Steady** 

For the latest reported month(August) employment was 58,340; an increase of 469 jobs from one year ago, but down 976 from July as summer workers returned to school. Growth in the Parish Labor Force continues to outpace the Region and the State with a 31% increase since August 2006.

AEDC staff is working on a number of *Projects in the Pipeline* which have the potential to create another 2,280 jobs, \$123 million in annual new payroll, and represent over \$17.4 billion in potential new investment. The level of activity in all three categories increased since last quarter by 20%-50%.
